- The I.R.W will provide direct support to inmates incarcerated at PGRCC and will work in collaboration with the Community Reintegration Worker (CRW) to support inmates released from PGRCC meet the conditions of their release plans.
- The I.R.W will provide direct program support to the CRW who provides clients with one to one outreach and Cultural support in the form of Talking Circles, Smudge Ceremony, and / or Sweat Lodge Ceremony.
- The I.R.W. will also work in collaboration with the Aboriginal Liaison Worker who works within PGRCC, supporting and actively facilitating inmate programming.
